Cayuga Centers changes lives wherever we go, establishing ourselves in geographic areas where much needed treatment and support services for youth and families have not existed.

This means exciting growth, increasing annual revenues from \$45 million to \$65 million since the first of 2017, and expanding the workforce to 766 positions.

Much of this expansion can be seen in our New York City programs which include Treatment Family Foster Care for children and families in the child welfare system, and Transitional Foster Care and Long-term Foster Care for Unaccompanied Children. (See Recent Highlights)

Headquartered in Auburn with locations throughout Central New York, Albany, Monroe, Bronx and Manhattan Counties, Palm Beach County, Florida and Delaware.

Recent Highlights:

Added over 200 Transitional Foster Care beds to our federally funded Unaccompanied Children program in NYC, bringing our total to 600 beds, and making us the largest foster home provider for this vulnerable population;

Awarded a new contract for 12 Long-Term Foster Care beds for Unaccompanied Children;

Doubled to 50 Treatment Family Foster Care beds contracted through New York City's Administration for Children's Services for children and families in the child welfare system;

Increased New York City program staff to 392 positions at 5 locations in Bronx and Harlem utilizing over 65,000 Sq. Ft. that includes administrative and program offices, health services, a learning center and classrooms, training room for foster parents and conference room areas.

Expanded our reach to Delaware to open a 12 bed Treatment Family Foster Care program for youth in the juvenile justice system;

Expanded our reach to Albany County opening a new Family Support Program serving families in the child welfare system to prevent youth removals from the home;

Grew the Palm Beach County Florida Treatment Family Foster Care Program offering enhanced foster care for children in the child welfare system;

Increased the capacity of Weekday Respite for Cayuga County families who have loved ones with developmental disabilities, and will continue expansion this year;

Served a total of 3,643 youth and families in 2016, with plans to serve many more in 2017.
